He was in Brazil earlier this year and preached in a lot of churches. It was great to see one more side of their history – from the perspective of a son that, although suffered a lot without his parents, became a pastor and is working now full-time in ministry. Missions Conference

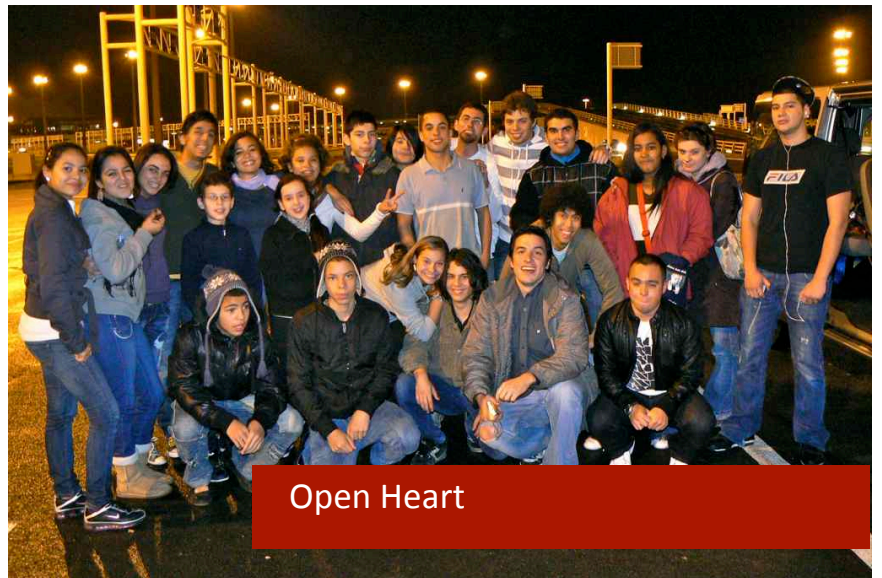
Open Heart: England
