Because of them we started this service there, every 2 weeks, on Saturdays. We're gathering at the same church as we had the baptism late last year – and it has been great! In the first service we had a Chilean/Swedish pastor blessing us, by sharing the Word. I've lead worship together with Fabian, also from Chile.

The greatest challenge has been raising new workers there in **Heerlen**, so that we can have an independent congregation there.

On March 8th I'll go back to Brazil. On the following day (the day I get there) we'll the *Flechas Para as Nações Project* – full-time!

This is a project that God has placed in our hearts for some years now. We started with the *Missionary Weeks* (in January we had the 8th), but now we'll start a Full-Time Training Center – from March until July.

Because of it I'll spend the first semester in Brazil, working in this project – and, God willing, starting others.

The challenges are many: new students, daily classes, language classes, music classes, social work in the community, missionary work at the end of the course, invited guests (pastors and teachers) from other parts of Brazil, among many other things we'll have in the School.

But, despite the great responsibility, we're trusting in God that to be a blessing, because it's not our project, but His.

Back to Germany

In the last few months the Lord is telling me to stay longer in Europe. I believe that the European nations are in great need of missionaries – and there's a lot yet to be! One of the doors that has opened is to study. Here in the city there's a very good University (Aachen is crowded with University), and there's an opportunity to go there – maybe to study *Business Administration*. For that, besides the language barrier – that, thank God, every day becomes smaller – I need to do a 1 year-long preparation course before I. It's quite expensive, but I can also apply for an scholarship. I want to send all the application documents before I go back to Brazil – so there's not a lot of time.

My desire with this course is not only to have an University Degree, but also to get a Training that will be useful in the Missionary Ministry. Apart from that, the need for highly professionally trained workers is high – and can open many doors. In *Switzerland*, for instance, there are no visas for missionaries – only for highly trained professionals.

Please pray so that every gets done in time and that we may be able to take the right decisions – those there are in God's heart, and not only ours. I know He has the best for our!
